Celebrating Candlelighters' 30th Anniversary After an ultrasound in July 2015, Monica and Mark found out they were pregnant with a baby boy, due in October. Monica had a smaller, athletic build but started experiencing high blood pressure that required medication. The medical team also diagnosed the baby with Cystic Kidney Disease (CKD or "Potter's Syndrome") which meant the baby had enlarged kidneys but no fluid. His kidneys were not producing the urine that would allow him to develop in utero. The prognosis was not good.



By the time Monica was 35 weeks pregnant, she had weekly doctor's appointments. The doctor told Monica he would do all he could to deliver a healthy baby. On August 24th, 2015, while Monica was out shopping with her mother, strong contractions started. She arrived at the hospital and after a quick and intense labor, baby MJ was born. The baby looked so fragile and the next few days would be crucial; Monica and Mark felt fortunate that the Prince of Peace Chaplain happened to be at the hospital that day to baptize MJ right after he was born. The doctors decided to place MJ on "comfort care" through hospice services and by the third day, Monica and Mark took baby MJ home.

At ten months old, MJ weighed 10 pounds and was removed from hospice care. In May 2016, MJ was admitted to Texas Children's Hospital where he was given a Gastrostomy Tube (or "G Tube") to help with his feedings. By November 2017, two-year-old MJ was on dialysis and was put on the list for a kidney transplant. He had what the doctors called a "dry run" to practice for transplant, but the kidney was not a good match. Throughout this ordeal, Monica and Mark experienced so many different emotions; one moment they were excited for MJ as he met various milestones, but simultaneously, they were sad that someone else had to be dying in order for their son to receive their kidney and live.

Finally, on May 17th, 2018, a perfect match came along! MJ went through all the transplant lab work, filled out the avalanche of necessary paperwork, and was admitted to the hospital later that day.

They administered medication to make him comfortable and as Monica left the room, MJ had a huge smile on his face. She thought, "what a great way to leave my son as he goes into this life-saving surgery." She knew he was in good hands.

During the surgery, the new kidney was placed in the belly and hooked to the main artery, leaving his own kidneys intact. At one point, MJ didn't seem to be responding well, so the physician removed the kidney, placed it back in the cooler, and gave MJ a break. They almost stopped the 12-hour operation. However, as God would have it, one of the OR surgeons was also a liver specialist. He decided to take a vein from a liver in the freezer and wire it into the kidney to complete the transplant. Fast forward, and MJ was intubated for a whole month.

Then, another 'God moment' happened. During one of the many tests and procedures MJ went through, he received an ultrasound where they found a lump in his liver. It was the very early stage of hepatoblastoma - liver cancer. Monica says, "The kidney transplant saved MJ's life because that is when the cancer was detected." Without the close monitoring, they may not have found the lump in time.

A month later, MJ had surgery to remove the tumor and he started chemotherapy treatments, with the last dose being administered right before Christmas of 2018. Candlelighters was there and supported MJ and his family from the moment he was diagnosed in June 2018 through today!



Candlelighters Parent Consultants met Mark and Monica right where they were: in the middle of chemo treatments and monitoring new kidney functions. Receiving parking assistance and one-on-one visits from Parent Consultants (fellow cancer moms who have been on a similar journey) was the biggest practical assistance from Candlelighters. As MJ has become more stable and as he gets closer to the end of his cancer treatment, the Griffiths family has become more involved in Candlelighters activities and events, especially Fun Walk! Each year, MJ has a team that walks in his neighborhood to help raise much needed funds for assistance for his and other cancer families, just like they have received.

MJ has gone through so much in his short life - in and out of hospitals, major surgeries, blood transfusions, needles poking him all over, and he's still such a trooper! Because the chemotherapy drugs are toxic, MJ's kidney is not doing great, but it is stable. In Monica's words, "Still rockin' stable!" MJ is now 6 years old and is a strong, sweet, happy, energetic boy who enjoys playing with his toys. And Candlelighters is thankful to have met MJ and his family along their journey!

SNAPSHOTS OF A MIRACLE By Kimberly Rex, Mother of Lane Rex

The picture on the left pops up every year, and every year I share it on Facebook. Less than 24 hours after this exact picture was taken, Lane and I would be medevacked by airplane to Houston from Corpus Christi to begin the battle for his life.

I'm teary today. Not because I'm sad, but because I cannot believe it's been eight whole years. I am overwhelmed with gratitude. This picture is a snapshot of God's perfect protection, His mercy, and His grace. When my husband Jason and I rewind the time in our minds to the months before Lane's childhood cancer diagnosis, we remember the way the Lord prepared our hearts, our minds, and our finances - it felt like every single detail was prepared and set in place before we knew what was to come. He knew what we would face because we live in a broken world, but He prepared us and went before us. He never left us. He was there before, He was right there during the most agonizing moments, and even still today. The Lord is right in our midst the entire time. It's mind-blowing to think of where we've come!

Somedays, I still struggle with the aftermath of what childhood cancer left behind for my son and my family. Post Traumatic Stress Disorder is very real, but the Lord's tenderness meets me every time I'm struggling. Going through Lane's cancer journey was the hardest season of our lives, but we wouldn't change who our family became because of it all.

If you need to see a miracle today, here's one for you. Look at the picture on the right. This is a picture of His healing touch over and over again, His miracles. Lane battled for a long, agonizing 1,217 days. It was a long walk. But here he is! VICTORIOUS! Our very own walking, talking, breathing miracle.

Lane is compassionate, empathetic, loving, kind, helpful, sensitive, brave, hilarious, smart as a whip, and wise way beyond his 12 years. He's been through more in his short life than most of us experience in an entire lifetime, so if you're hurting, need someone to cry with you, or want to talk about life, Lane is your guy. He is also busy all the time, never sits still, is fearless, drives me bonkers, likes to prank people, is loud, rowdy, and has a big, giant personality! He was knit together in my womb so perfectly and created to be exactly who he is today... our beautiful mess! Our home and our lives would be much too quiet without our Lane. Our healthy and whole "Laner." God is able!

This year, we will celebrate 5 years since his last chemotherapy on December 8th, and on that day, he will finally, officially be declared cancer free! Five years off of treatment and moving into long-term survivorship. My words fall short, but every day for the rest of my days, I will give Him thanks and glory.



30 YEARS OF WALKING ALONGSIDE FAMILIES

The History of the Parent Consultant Program & Candlelighters in Houston

In 1975, the Parent Consultant position came into being at Rhode Island Hospital in Providence, Rhode Island, through the efforts of an energetic Candlelighters parent, Eugenia Wild. In 1985 and 1986, The Parent Consultant Role in Pediatric Oncology was published by authors Paul Pitel, MD, Ann Pitel, Helena Richards, Joy Benson, and Edward Forman, MD, in two separate publications - the Children's Healthcare Journal (1985) and The Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Foundation Progress Reports. By 1986, more than twelve treatment centers staffed Parent Consultants, including one hospital in Johannesburg, South Africa. Parent advocate programs around the country and the world were creating valuable support for families facing childhood cancer. And in Houston, there was a need for support like this.

Candlelighters kicked off in Houston in 1989 with two parent support groups in the Texas Medical Center: one at Texas Children's Cancer Center and one at The Children's Cancer Hospital at MD Anderson Cancer Center. The parent group at Texas Children's Cancer Center sought formal incorporation, and in 1993, Candlelighters Childhood Cancer Family Alliance was legally formed. In the fall of 1993, they invited the parent group from The Children's Cancer Hospital at MD Anderson Cancer Center to join them and the two organizations merged into one.

The founding families' first plan of action was to develop a program to connect families of children with cancer to provide the kind of support they wished they had while their children were on active treatment. Thus, the Parent Consultant Program was born and here to stay! Since 1993, Candlelighters Parent Consultants (parents of children with cancer) have been providing daily support to families of children receiving treatment at Texas Children's Hospital and MD Anderson Cancer Center Hospital in the Texas Medical Center. Since then, we have grown from two Parent Consultants to five, and have extended our outreach efforts to families receiving treatment at Children's Memorial Hermann, Texas Children's Hospital West in Katy, and Texas Children's Hospital in The Woodlands. This year, we celebrate 30 years of walking alongside our childhood cancer families!



CANDLELIGHTERS CHILDHOOD CANCER FAMILY ALLIANCE'S MISSION IS TO PROVIDE EMOTIONAL, EDUCATIONAL, AND PRACTICAL SUPPORT TO CHILDREN WITH CANCER AND THEIR FAMILIES.

Candlelighters began in 1989 with two parent support groups from the Texas Medical Center: one at Texas Children's Cancer Center and one at MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital. The parent group at Texas Children's Cancer Center sought formal incorporation, and in 1993 Candlelighters was legally formed. In the fall of 1993, they invited the parent group from the MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital to join them and the two organizations merged into one. 30 years later, we've added Children's Memorial Hermann to our partner hospital list, along with local Texas Children's Hospital satellite locations. The Parent Consultant Program was developed to directly meet the needs of families at the treatment centers and to inform them of potential resources. Our programs and services extend beyond the hospital walls with our Family Camp, Adopt-A-Family, Fall Festival, Candlelighters Newsletter, and other special events. Over the years, we have learned how critically valuable it is for our Parent Consultants to be able to directly impact families through emotional support, parking assistance, meal passes, gas cards, and more. It is our greatest honor and privilege to bring this type of comfort and hope to childhood cancer families.
