We are grateful that our partner hospitals have embraced our Parent Consultant staff members and see the benefit of the peer-to-peer support they provide families on their childhood cancer journey.

What is a Candlelighters Parent Consultant?

PARENT CONSULTANTS ARE CANDLELIGHTERS STAFF WHO HAVE WALKED THIS SAME ROAD

They stood by their children as they fought childhood cancer, and now they are here to stand with you.

They provide daily emotional, educational, & practical support filled with words of hope, gestures of kindness, knowledge, and an understanding that can only come from someone who has walked in your shoes.

HOW DO PARENT CONSULTANTS HELP FAMILIES?

The Parent Consultant Program was developed to directly meet the needs of families being treated at our partner hospitals - to inform them of potential community resources and provide assistance through Candlelighters. Each Parent Consultant knows what it's like to be the parent of a child with cancer. They provide emotional, educational, and practical support to families of children being treated at The University of Texas MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital, Texas Children's Cancer & Hematology Center, Texas Children's Hospital West Campus, Texas Children's Hospital The Woodlands, and Children's Memorial Hermann Hospital.

Some examples of the emotional and practical support Parent Consultants provide childhood cancer families on a daily basis includes:





SURVIVOR TO SCIENTIST: A JOURNEY OF HOPE & DISCOVERY

5-Year Cancer Survivor's Path To Advancements in Pediatric Oncology by Bella Lawlar



Cancer to anyone is a big and scary word, but it is especially scary when you haven't even had the chance to graduate high school yet. In December of 2018, I ended up in the E.R. with some intense nose bleeds. In fact, they were so bad that I had to miss weeks' worth of school to manage them. I met with an Ear, Nose & Throat Specialist who thought the problem could be polyps in my sinuses, but one CT scan later showed there was a lesion and a much more serious issue.

In February 2019, an MRI and two biopsies determined that the mass in my head and sinuses was in fact cancerous, as well as dangerously close to my brain. Surgery was scheduled immediately to remove the mass, but it was canceled as I was in the pre-op room preparing for the surgery. The doctors sent the biopsy sample to a different laboratory in Florida for a second opinion while my tumor continued to grow. After several weeks of waiting for this second opinion, we decided to take matters into our own hands and take my diagnosis to MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital. Before they could even provide me an official diagnosis, they could see how just how bad the cancer had gotten while I was waiting for answers.

I vividly remember the events that took place during those first two weeks of my inpatient stay at MD Anderson. It was during Spring Break in 2019, and the doctors ordered every possible test that they could: MRIs, CT scans, PET scans, copious amounts of bloodwork, cardiovascular assessments, and even hearing tests. I also remember meeting with a social worker to submit my Make-a-Wish request, as my 18th birthday was just days away.

Once the doctors had their hands on my biopsied tissue, I was officially diagnosed with sarcoma - a type of cancer that arises from the cells of connective tissue. Once we had a diagnosis, things began to move much faster. On March 18th, I had my port placed. The very next day, I started chemotherapy. I did my first treatment as an in-patient so they could monitor me as I was receiving the medications for the first time. I remember coming home after treatment and feeling very scared and worried for what was to come - what if something bad happened while I wasn't at the hospital with doctors and nurses ready to help me?

Despite this life-altering event, I was still a high school student, a senior, nonetheless. My chemotherapy regimen contained two very aggressive treatment plans, so I enrolled in homeschooled for the remainder of the year.



Schoolwork got harder and harder to complete as my cancer treatment went on. While not an ideal situation for an 18-year-old, I still managed to have fun. When my hair started to fall out, I made it worthwhile and hosted a party. So many of my friends and family attended to help with shaving my head. My friends also organized my very own prom "masquerade" party, which was such a blast and a core memory for me. Even though I spent the remainder of the semester in the hospital, I still got to attend my high school graduation in between treatments - a memory I will cherish.

Before my high school graduation, my care team performed more scans, and thankfully those showed I was responding well to treatment and the tumor was shrinking! But even with such good news, I still had many more rounds of chemotherapy and planned proton radiation therapy to ensure the cancer was completely gone.

I was disappointed that treatment was taking so long, as it had always been my dream and personal goal to go away to attend college. I had several acceptance offers, but my dreams were put on hold. Due to the harsh nature of the chemotherapy, my treatment took longer to finish than expected due to many of the awful side effects. By the time I was finished, the fall semester had already started, and I had to wait until the next semester to start my college journey. Despite my disappointment, I remained focused on completing treatment and feeling better for the following school semester. I finished treatment on September 13th, 2019, and have had "no evidence of disease" ever since! After monthly, then yearly, check-ups, scans and bloodwork, I reached my Long-Term Survivorship status (five years cancer-free) last year in 2024!

In 2023, I earned a Bachelor of Science in Biology from Sam Houston State University in 2023. During my last semester, I worked in a research lab and completed applications to several other universities offering PhD genetics programs. I am proud to say that I'm now a first-year Genetics PhD student at Texas A&M University! While taking classes this semester, i'm also serving as a Teaching Assistant for the undergraduate genetics lab and working on research. I am so excited to be living my dream and accomplishing the goals I set for myself. After completing my PhD, I hope to work at a hospital like MD Anderson Cancer Center and contribute to much-needed pediatric cancer research, helping lead advancements in pediatric oncology.

2024 LIGHTS OF COURAGE HONOREES

Honoring The Brave & Celebrating The Light in The Darkness

Zachary and Liam, fraternal twins born just one minute apart, had their lives changed in June 2018 when Zach began showing symptoms of illness. Initially, swollen lymph nodes were followed by fatigue, bruising, nosebleeds, and petechiae, prompting medical visits. After tests, Zach was diagnosed with cancer just two weeks before his second birthday.

Zach spent 16 days in the hospital for treatment. When he returned home, Liam, though excited to see his brother, showed signs of emotional hesitation, as he was unsure about becoming attached again. Their second birthday was spent in the hospital for treatment, where Zach was also diagnosed with C-Diff and SIADH. Afterward, Zach's steroid treatment caused significant weight gain, making it difficult for him to walk.

During this time, Liam became Zach's primary source of emotional support, bringing toys and acting as his "nurse." He encouraged Zach to play and move, handfeeding him and comforting him during painful procedures. Their time away from daycare, due to Zach's weakened immune system, allowed them to form an even closer bond. As Liam grew, he sometimes expressed a desire to be sick himself for attention and one-on-one time with his mom, highlighting the emotional toll of Zach's illness.

As they matured, both boys adapted. Zach is now healthy but faces lingering learning and executive functioning challenges. Liam, showing remarkable maturity, has supported Zach emotionally and academically. He understands his brother's needs and is always there to guide and encourage him.

While raising twins is hard, having one go through cancer treatment added extra strain. Through it all, Liam's love and support proved to be a constant source of strength, making him exactly what Zach needed during those difficult times.



Childhood Cancer Survivor Honoree Megan Spies

In April 2003, after experiencing severe daily headaches, I visited my eye doctor, who suspected my glasses needed adjusting but soon realized it was something major. I was referred to Texas Children's Hospital, where I was diagnosed with an astrocytoma (brain tumor) after an MRI and surgery. I spent nine days in the hospital, dealing with a drainage tube and a mess of curly hair, which a friend's mom, a hairdresser, kindly fixed afterward. After a brief return to school, I began six weeks of radiation to shrink the remaining tumor. My grandparents took me to the Methodist Hospital annex near NRG Stadium for treatment, and we often stopped by the Candlelighters office for support, where I received small toys, including a teddy bear that became my favorite.

I later attended Baylor University, where I joined the Baylor Relay for Life Committee and reconnected with LeighAnna Hutchinson, a fellow childhood cancer survivor. She invited me to volunteer at a camp for families affected by childhood cancer, which turned out to be the same organization that had helped my family years earlier. Since then, I have volunteered at Camp annually, except in 2017 when it was canceled due to Hurricane Harvey. I've also helped virtually during 2021's online camp and participated in a day camp in 2022.

I love seeing kids and families bond over shared experiences, and I'm proud to share my story - offering hope and encouragement to those still on their cancer journey. It's been amazing to watch my campers grow, start families, and continue thriving. Even 21 years after my diagnosis, Candlelighters continues to positively impact my life and the lives of many others.



On-Treatment Honoree
Mya Guerra



Mya was born with a birth defect that required two surgeries by the age of 1, but she grew into a determined and energetic child. She loved helping her younger brothers and enjoyed school. However, in December 2022, her health began to decline with persistent fevers, paleness, leg pain, and fatigue. Initially, doctors suspected an infection, but her symptoms worsened. On December 12, 2022, her mother took her to the emergency room, where lab results revealed a dangerously low blood level of 3.1 (normal is 10-11). Mya was life-flighted to Temple, TX, and later transferred to downtown Houston, where further tests, including a bone marrow biopsy and lumbar puncture, confirmed her diagnosis of B-cell acute lymphoblastic leukemia (ALL), with leukemia cells also found in her cerebrospinal fluid (CSF).

Treatment began immediately with chemotherapy, lumbar punctures, antibiotics, and steroids. Mya had to stay inpatient at the hospital, and her family adjusted to the new routine, with her dad staying at the hospital while her mother worked. Mya spent Christmas, New Year's, and her birthday in the hospital, which was tough for her. Despite the challenges, Mya has had a strong support system from family, friends, her school, and the community.

Now 19 months into treatment, Mya has endured multiple rounds of chemotherapy, lumbar punctures, and port access procedures, resulting in complete hair loss. However, she is resilient, growing new hair, and continuing to stay positive by dancing through her cancer journey. The family remains hopeful and continues to take things one day at a time, believing that Mya will proudly ring the bell to mark the end of treatment in April 2025!

Jackie Robins is the mother of Vincent Michael Robins, who passed away on August 10, 2021, after a brave battle with a rare colon cancer. Vinny, born on Christmas Eve in 2003, was the youngest of 10 children, and his twin brother, Eli, was his closest companion. Vinny was a healthy, energetic child who enjoyed activities like running track, skateboarding, and fishing with his brothers.

In January 2019, Vinny experienced severe abdominal pain, which was initially thought to be severe constipation. However, by February 2019, the pain and worse symptoms continued, leading to a diagnosis of high-risk stage 3 colon cancer. Vinny's cancer, Signet Ring Cell Adenocarcinoma, was rare and aggressive, affecting only 1% of all colorectal cancer cases. After six months of aggressive chemotherapy, Vinny went into remission, but tragically, 11 months later, his cancer returned and had spread to his peritoneum and pelvis, becoming stage 4 metastatic colon cancer.

During this difficult time, the Robins family found support through Candlelighters Parent Consultants and our various avenues of care for cancer families. Candlelighters helped them through Vinny's illness with meaningful events, tickets to sports games, and participating in fundraising and awareness activities like the annual Candlelighters Fun Walk.

Vinny's health declined rapidly, and the family lost him in 2021. Despite their immense grief, they continue to honor his memory with ongoing support from Candlelighters, attending events that bring them joy and comfort. Jackie expresses her eternal gratitude to Candlelighters for their unwavering support, ensuring that Vinny's legacy lives on in their hearts.



Texas Children's Hospital & UT MD Anderson Announce Joint Venture To End Childhood Cancer

HOUSTON, TEXAS | February 19, 2025 IN A RECENT PRESS RELEASE, BOTH HOSPITALS ANNOUNCED THE FOLLOWING:

Texas Children's Hospital and The University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center have announced a transformational collaboration dedicated solely to pediatric cancer care. Approved by the Texas Children's Board of Trustees and the UT System Board of Regents, this new, firstof-its-kind joint venture will unite the nation's largest comprehensive pediatric system and a top pediatric cancer program with the nation's leading comprehensive cancer center. The collaboration has a single mission: to end childhood cancer.

"The scope and scale of our combined effort will build the world's preeminent pediatric cancer center, addressing the growing need for excellent patient care and greatly benefiting children with cancer through increased access to care and to clinical trials," said Peter WT Pisters, M.D., President of MD Anderson. "MD Anderson and Texas Children's offer unique strengths that when brought together will accelerate improved outcomes for patients in Texas and around the world."

Collaborative operations and patient care will launch in early 2026. A focus on new facilities is required to offer patients and their families a best-in-class healing environment with the latest medical technology designed specifically with them in mind. Specifics are not yet established but will be forthcoming. The combination of Texas Children's and MD Anderson patient populations will increase pediatric cancer clinical trials, ultimately expediting discoveries and enhancing the availability of innovative cancer treatments. Texas has one of the youngest and fastest growing populations in the country and has the second most total pediatric cancer cases in the United States, creating a significant opportunity for scientific advancement through this ioint venture.

In the fall of 1993, they invited the parent group from the MD Anderson Children's Cancer Hospital to join them and the two organizations merged into one. The Parent Consultant Program was developed to directly meet the needs of families at the treatment centers and to inform them of potential resources. Our programs and services extend beyond the hospital walls with our Family Camp, Adopt-A-Family, Fall Festival, Candlelighters Newsletter, and other special events. Over the years, we have learned how critically valuable it is for our Parent Consultants to be able to directly impact families through emotional support, parking assistance, meal passes, gas cards, and more. It is our greatest honor and privilege to bring this type of comfort and hope to childhood cancer families.
